Over a 10 week rehearsal process, A.B.L.E.'s teen and adult ensembles collaborated with a team of teaching artists and volunteer facilitators to devise two original productions:

#### Are You Still Watching

A.B.L.E.'s teen ensembles reflected on the many ways our assumptions – both good and bad – inform how we interact with the world. The result was a unique mix of scenes, monologues, and movement pieces inspired by the lives and experiences of the ensemble.

#### O for a Muse

A.B.L.E.'s adult ensemble remixed some of The Bard's classics in a unique evening of storytelling. Featuring brand new tales written by the ensemble, interwoven with text from Romeo & Juliet, Titus Andronicus, Hamlet, and other Shakespearean classics, *O for a Muse* celebrates the magic of everyday objects.

Both shows were staged in partnership with The Theatre School at DePaul University.

livestream events with audiences tuning in from around the country, and as far away as Canada, Scotland, and New Zealand. A.B.L.E.'s ensembles were 3 weeks into rehearsals for their spring projects when the COVID19 pandemic forced us to reimagine how we work. We shifted quickly to offer virtual sessions via Zoom. Our teaching teams learned new technology on the fly, and together, we improvised a new way of working together.

Ensembles collaborated on two innovative digital projects:

#### **Comedy of Errors: The Webseries**

The 20 actors of A.B.L.E.'s teen ensembles brought Shakespeare's tale of mistaken identity to the screen in a 5-episode webseries. Filmed entirely on Zoom, actors created their own costumes, props and sound effects using items found in their homes

#### O for a Muse: The Short Story Collection

The adult ensemble imagined 5 original tales inspired by objects from Shakespeare such as a crown, a ring and a handkerchief. These were turned into a series of downloadable stories featuring illustrations by the cast, accompanied by Shakespeare-inspired videos.

## **OTHER SEASON HIGHLIGHTS**

- In October, we forged a new outreach partnership with the **Northern Suburban Special Recreation Association**.
- For the 3rd year in a row, A.B.L.E. welcomed guest artists from the internationally acclaimed physical theatre company,
  Frantic Assembly to lead workshops for our ensemble and teaching team
- We shared A.B.L.E.'s methodology and mission with other educators and performers at Northwestern University's Inclusive Theatre Festival and the Mid-America Theatre Conference, and through accessibility consulting for The House Theatre and Chicago Shakespeare Theater.

- Ensembles took **5 Field Trips** to professional productions including an advanced screening of *The Peanut Butter Falcon* and backstage tour of The Goodman Theatre.
- We invested in our teaching artists and facilitators by offering **5 Professional Development Trainings** including behavior management for the arts classroom with Becky Leifman from CO/LAB Theater Group, and a virtual session with Flute Theatre from the U.K.
- We launched A.B.L.E. At Home which featured a video series of theatre games and activities, and several productions from A.B.L.E.'s archive, all available to stream free of charge.





## LOOKING FORWARD

We will continue to do our best to ensure everyone is A.B.L.E. to connect, contribute and create - whatever the future holds.

FY21 will bring A.B.L.E.'s 5th birthday as a 501c3 organization. It will also undoubtedly bring more unknowns and surprises. Still, we are committed to continuing our growth with a few key strategic goals:

- Adding a 4th ensemble to accommodate participants from our program waitlist.
- **Doubling our workshop offerings** throughout the year - online, and inperson if allowed.
- Packaging A.B.L.E. curricula for licensing by other organizations that serve individuals with I/DD.

- Creating a **Diversity Equity &** Inclusion task force that will assess and encourage greater diversity across the organization.
- Adhering to a new matrix for **Board** recruitment that ensures a range of backgrounds are included in organizational leadership, and recruit at least 1 new member into the Board of Directors under these guidelines.
- Increase individual giving by 10% with a focus on growing monthly donations. These will provide a predictable revenue stream that will allow us to plan ahead.
