A.B.L.E. will offer a workshop before both performances of *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.



Workshops will start **one hour before the house opens** on each day.

The workshops will last 45 minutes.



## 1) Who will I meet at the Workshop?

	I will get to meet and play with many different people during the workshop including:  • 3 Teaching Artists  • 2 Creative Associates  • Other audience members attending the show
???	<b>Teaching Artists</b> direct A.B.L.E.'s ensembles. They work together to create lesson plans, and make sure everyone has the tools they need to succeed.
	The same 3 Teaching Artists will co-lead both workshops.  Their names are:  • Kaylie Honkala  • Arin Mulvaney  • Melanie Zehner
???	Creative Associates (CA) are long-time A.B.L.E. ensemble members who have jobs with A.B.L.E They are employed to co-lead outreach sessions and support administrative projects.
	Two different Creative Associates will support each pre-show workshop.

	There will be up to 20 participants in each workshop.  All of the participants are people attending A.B.L.E.'s production of <i>A Midsummer Night's Dream.</i> We are all part of the A.B.L.E. community.
	All of us will work together to learn new things!
	One way we can support each other is by wearing a mask that covers my nose and mouth at the workshop and during the show. This is to help protect people around me who might be at risk for getting very sick by being around a lot of people.

### 2) Getting to the Workshop at Chicago Shakespeare Theater



The workshop will take place at Chicago Shakespeare Theater on Navy Pier.

There are many different ways to get there. A.B.L.E. has created another social story all about Transportation to Navy Pier.

I will arrive at the main lobby for Chicago Shakespeare Theater.



First, I will have to get my tickets.

When I enter the lobby, I can turn **RIGHT** to **get my tickets from the Box Office**.



Then, I can wait in the lobby until an A.B.L.E. team member lets me know that it is time to go to the workshop.




The workshop will take place in **Dress Circle** on the second floor.

The furniture will be moved out of the way so we have space to move and work.

There are two ways to get to the Dress Circle: I could take the stairs or the elevator.






#### TO TAKE THE STAIRS:

If I am facing the box office, I will look LEFT to see the stairs. They are just past the bust of Shakespeare's head.

I can take the stairs up one level to the workshop.

When I come up the stairs an A.B.L.E. team member will greet me.






#### TO TAKE THE ELEVATOR:

If I am facing the box office, I will look to my RIGHT to see the elevators.

I can take the elevator to the **second floor**.

When I get off of the elevator, an A.B.L.E. team member will greet me and help to point me in the right direction. I will turn right at the pillar to go toward the rehearsal space.



The workshop area is on the second floor. There is a Circular Gallery that gives the area it's name "The Dress Circle."

I can look down or up from the hallways.

I should not lean on the railings or over the railings.

If I am scared of heights, I don't have to go near the railing.



If I need to use the bathroom or get a drink of water during the workshop the bathrooms are located on the other side of the Dress Circle.





The workshop is in a public space.


I might hear conversation from people in the lobby, or there might be people who pass by on their way to other spaces in the building.

The Creative Associates and Teaching Artists will help all of us workshop participants find our way to the performance.

The performance is in the **Upstairs Theater on the 6th Floor**. I can take the stairs or the elevator.

Workshop participants will be able to go into the theatre first, and can select our seats first!
